A guide to meeting your MP





What to expect

Your MP has now received the email you sent them requesting a meeting (in-person or online) about tax dodging and the UN Tax Convention. Someone in their office will reply.

If your MP agrees to meet, arrange a time that is convenient to you. If they direct you to one of their drop-in sessions, have the chat there.

If they refuse to meet, please express polite disappointment and let us know by email.

How to prepare

You don't need to be an expert on tax or politics – far from it! But if you'd like to prepare for the meeting, you could:

- Read our article on the UN Tax Convention.
- Think about how tax dodging might relate to you; tax dodging means less money for the UK government, which means less funding for public services. Are you seeing the closure of local public services in your area?
- Reflect on it personally. How do you feel about the fact that you have to pay tax, if you work, while the super-rich pay nothing on their extreme wealth?

Key Facts

Countries lose £388 billion each year to tax dodging by big corporations and the super-rich. This money could be funding our public services and action on climate.

The UN Tax Convention is a ground-breaking treaty being negotiated at the UN over the next 2 years. It could make it much easier to tax multinationals and the ultra-wealthy. If every country around the world joins the convention, the billionair won't have anywhere to go to keep tax dodging.

The UK is one of 9 countries that voted against the UN Tax Convention last year.

What to say

- Introduce yourself: When you get to the meeting, introduce yourself, mention that you live in your MP's constituency, and thank them for meeting you.
- Be polite, patient and friendly: it will make your MP much more likely to listen to you! If you voted for them, mention that.
- Explain why you're there: that you're unhappy that big corporations and the super-rich are dodging taxes, depriving the government of money it needs for public services and action on climate – and any other reasons you have.
- Tell them that you're disappointed that the UK government has been voting against the UN Tax Convention – a ground-breaking new treaty which would make it much easier to tax big corporations and the super-rich.
- Encourage them to <u>read War on Want's</u> <u>briefing</u> for more info and to speak out in favour of the UN Tax Convention.
- Remember: you don't need to be an expert in tax dodging! Your MP probably isn't either.
 Your job is to show them it's an issue you care about.

FAQs

What's the point? My MP won't care.

Even if your MP doesn't respond, if they know that their constituents care about an issue, they are more likely to care about it.

I don't have enough time or can't meet my MP for other reasons.
