Today, migrant workers across the UK face racism, abuse and exploitation. The government is creating a hostile environment for migrant workers. We must stand up for the right of ALL workers to decent pay and basic rights at work.

Immigration controls are undermining basic workers' rights. Migrant workers are afraid to report exploitation to labour rights enforcement bodies\* for fear they'll be arrested, detained, deported and treated as criminals. No one should be criminalised for working to provide for their basic needs.

Only by protecting equal social and labour rights for all workers can we stop a race to the bottom where employers drive down working conditions for everyone.

We must fight to ensure all workers enjoy basic rights at work. Write to your MP today.
